WHAT IS TOYOHARI

Toyohari is a form of Keiraku Chiryo, a Japanese meridian therapy. It is a theoretically simple yet technically sophisticated complete acupuncture system. Toyohari sets itself apart from most other forms of acupuncture by being a more subtle and sensitive treatment method that places great emphasis on pulse diagnosis and palpation skills.

The Toyohari Medical Association has developed unique training and teaching methods that can expedite the acquisition of these skills, which typically take many years of practice to attain. Many individuals who have studied the Toyohari style within acupuncture have expressed that it resembles more closely what they initially expected to study in their acupuncture foundational education.

THE HISTORY

Kodo Fukushima, a blind Japanese acupuncturist, founded the Toyohari Medical Association in 1959 as an advancement of the meridian therapy practiced by blind practitioners in the 1930s and 1940s. Initially, the association was dedicated to Japanese meridian therapy for blind students and practitioners, but today it includes both sighted and visually impaired members. Many experienced instructors within the association are blind and possess significant clinical experience.

In Japan, Toyohari is taught as a 20-day postgraduate course spread over two years. Following the “Kozato Study Method,” the association’s experienced senior members provide instruction through highly organized academic and practical training methods. The European branch of Toyohari, EBTA, has developed a training program that follows the Tokyo-based curriculum.

Before his passing, the former chairman of the Toyohari Association, Kodo Fukushima, wrote the book “Meridian Therapy.” This book is required reading for Toyohari postgraduate education and, along with handouts, silver needles, and a gold-plated teishin (one of the classic 9 needles from Nanjing), is included in the training program’s price.

TOYOHARI PRINCIPLES

The principle among the techniques used in the Toyohari system is:

- Diagnosis: focuses particularly on pulse diagnosis and touch diagnosis.
- Treatment: very delicate supplementation technique; various draining techniques; harmonizing technique (waho); “contact” needling techniques (sanshin); warming moxa (chinetsukyu), direct moxa (okyu), cupping (kyukaku), specialized treatment of the neck and inguinal regions to relieve symptoms (naso & muno), specialized use of the extraordinary vessels (kikei), specialized use of midday-midnight method (shigo).
- Participants will significantly enhance their pulse and tactile diagnostic and assessment skills..
- Participants will also develop a heightened sense of qi sensitivity by utilizing Toyohari needle techniques.
- Participants will learn a variety of methods specifically aimed at relieving symptoms
- To participate in ongoing study groups, individuals can become members of the Toyohari Association in English.

POST-GRADUATE EDUCATION

Graduating from the 150-hour program entitles the participant to become a member of the Toyohari Medical Association through one of EBTA’s European branches, as well as to become a registered Toyohari practitioner.

Currently, there are eight EBTA branches: Dutch, British, German, Danish, Swiss, Spanish, Portuguese, and Israeli. The primary purpose of these branches is to promote and enhance clinical skills by offering ongoing study opportunities in EBTA study groups and study sessions with senior instructors in Japan and Europe. The European Branch of the Toyohari Association was established to facilitate these educational opportunities.

Upon completion of the international Toyohari program, participants will receive a certificate signed by EBTA and the association's headquarters in Tokyo. They will then be eligible to become members of the Toyohari Association through one of the EBTA branches.

All teaching and professional communication will be conducted in easily understandable English as it is the common professional language of the association. Lars Schuster will be present during all teaching sessions and can address any understanding issues.

All theory will be directly applied to practical skills. Approximately 70% of the program consists of supervised practical training, and for each teaching day, there will be a minimum of two instructors and two assistants available for supervision.

The program is taught by two founding EBTA instructors and approximately ten other competent international instructors, all of whom have been trained in previous international Toyohari programs.

founding instructors: Stephen Birch, Academic Dean of EBTA and the inaugural recipient of the Kodo Fukushima Award. Junko Ida, President of EBTA, former President of the first American branches, and recipient of the Kozato Award. Both have studied and lived in Japan, Europe, and the USA.

Other instructors: Joke Bik-Nowee, Marian Fixler, Sue Preedy, Miguel Cabrer Mir, Anja Stiehle, Ramin Khaknegar-Moghaddam, Sascha Gröbe, Nicolas Hüppelshäuser og Lars Schuster, der alle har studeret intenst i Europa og Japan.
